This book is more than the recall of the Danes Family Murders. It details how an entire community was impacted by this horrific tragedy. Before this senseless crime the community of Lees Creek operated like a large extended family where everyone trusted their neighbor and by extension the world in general. Everyone left their car doors and doors to their houses unlocked. Donald Danes by all accounts was a great neighbor and the Danes family was well thought of. Lion Jim Georges recalled times when he would call Donald Danes to borrow tools to repair his farm equipment and he was never refused. If this terrible crime could happen to this family, then who was safe? Innocence was forever lost as Lees Creek locked their doors and their hearts. Fear permeated the community and the county until the two perpetrators of this crime, Terry Kauffman (sp) and Danny Hooks, were arrested, convicted, and sentenced to death. In the depositions taken leading up to the trial it was learned that these two men had been taking drugs and drinking for days prior to the crime. These two men had a negative influence on each other and it is extremely doubtful that either would have carried out the crime if not influenced by the other. The little village of Lees Creek was never the same. Innocence lost can never be regained.
