* 13-J GOALS *

1. For every club which asks for assistance, there will be programs designed for them to increase club

membership. Clubs with 10 or less members will increase membership by 25% by December 31, 2010 and exceed 12 members by June 30, 2011.

2. The number of clubs in 13-J will increase by 2 by June 30, 2011.

3. 3 extension workshops will be held in the district by June 30, 2011. Two of the workshops will be conducted before December 31, 2010.

4. 3 Leo Clubs will be added in the district by June 30, 2011.

5. 13-J will increase the number of clubs sponsoring Peace Poster Contests by 50% during the 2010-11 Lions year.

6. 13-J will have a declared candidate for 2nd Vice District Governor by January 1, 2011.

7. A district newsletter will be distributed on a monthly basis to each club within the district.

You can readily see that it will take many Lions wanting to be better for all of this to happen.

If your club falls into the parameters established in Goal #1, please, PLEASE, keep in mind that we do not want to run your show.

We want to help you better serve your community. You must want to do this or it will not succeed. It's up to you to call and ask for our assistance.

To avoid confusion and to give you plenty of time to prepare your entries, the District Contests are being announced now.

Healthy Club Award will recognize membership improvement. Clubs must show a net membership growth and verify a successful retention outcome.

Excellence in Communication Award has been established to improve communications concerning Lions Club activities and purpose, need for new members, and sponsorship encouragement. A scrapbook should be prepared demonstrating such efforts.

District Governor’s Contest encourages: timely reporting, interclub activities; attendance at district, state, and international functions; support of Lions’ state and international programs and the motto, “We Serve.” The District Governor’s Contest has three divisions: large clubs with 51 or more members, medium sized clubs with 26 to 50 members, and small clubs with 25 or less.

The District Governor’s Leo Contest has changed slightly and will be explained to Leo Advisors and Officers in August and in the new district directory.

These contests are designed to give every size club a chance to win. Just ask Lynchburg a club with less than 20 members which consistently wins awards.
